    - a) Character development is part of the current CREW portion of Exepditionary Learning (EL) curriculum.
    - b) Character development is integrated into the general curriculum, it is not intended to be stand alone.

  - 2. Emphasis on the role of the curriculum committee being to ensure that all curriculum not only aligns with Idaho State standards, but also adheres to HCC culture and beliefs

- 3. Noted by Bill that it is important to remember HCC does not teach to curriculum, we teach to standards.
- 4. Mention made by Mallory, and supported by Bill, that there is no perfect curriculum. The committee just needs to find what best meets the needs of our students.
