

HCC Music Performance Policies

Our intention is to celebrate the work of our students in Music classes by inviting families and friends to participate in concerts. These concerts are TBA each year in timely manner, at least 4 weeks ahead of time, so that families can adequately plan to attend. Announcements are on Class Dojo, Facebook and in printed flyers which are displayed at the music room. Flyers are also sent home in printed form. Please make every effort to make the concert dates a priority and invite friends and family to these great times we share with our school and community.

Students are strongly encouraged to attend their class performances and participate in the public display of our work which is part of our EL learning model. The expectation is that the students and families will arrive 30 minutes before the performance and be ready to perform at the designated time.

Our students have discussed “concert dress” and what this means for our school. Instead of our school uniform, students are planning ahead to select an outfit which is a dressy and yet comfortable for these times. An example is a nice skirt, dress or pants (no jeans) outfit for girls with comfortable shoes. For the boys, nice pants (no jeans) and a button up shirt, with clean, comfortable shoes. The main idea is that we want students to feel like this is a special night to put forth our best efforts presenting our work. We want to show up ready to perform and to look like performers to represent the pride we share in our school and what we are doing.

The journey we share in Music is meant to result in a lifelong love of music and positive, interactive experiences in class. The lessons we learn along the way are incredibly valuable to our students and all who know them. As we look forward to concert season, we thank all involved for their support and assistance with making these events happen.
